While the focus is on applicants at the Assistant Professorship level, outstanding senior candidates will be considered. Applicants must hold a Ph.D. in Chemistry or Materials Science. Candidates are expected to develop a vigorous, internationally visible, and well-funded research program and to effectively teach and mentor undergraduate and graduate students. We are a Ph.D. granting department whose mission is to lead in undergraduate and graduate education and research ventures.
