

**Visiting Assistant Professor of Chemistry – One-Year Appointment 2021-2022**  
(Biochemistry Position)

**Position Summary.** The Department of Chemistry at Gettysburg College invites applications for a one-year, full-time, Visiting Assistant Professor position beginning August 2021. The candidate will contribute to courses and laboratories in General Chemistry and Biochemistry, including teaching the lecture for the second semester of Biochemistry. The teaching load for this position will be three courses each semester, where both lecture and laboratory sections count as one course each.

**Qualifications.** We seek an individual who has a genuine interest in teaching within the liberal arts. Candidates must have a doctorate (or be ABD) in chemistry or a closely allied field. College-level teaching experience is preferred. We strongly encourage applications from candidates who can demonstrate through their teaching that they can contribute to the diversity and inclusive excellence of our community.
