Description

The C. Eugene Bennett Department of Chemistry at West Virginia University invites applications for a Teaching Assistant Professor position beginning in August 2021. The primary responsibility is teaching large-lecture sections of undergraduate chemistry courses and supervising the associated laboratory sections. The successful candidate can also expect to teach advanced undergraduate courses in their area of specialization, based upon departmental needs. The position requires service to the department, college, and university. This is a 9-month, full-time, non-tenure track position with full benefits and the opportunity for promotion. Teaching Assistant Professor appointments have renewable terms of up to three years, with no limit on the number of terms.

The Department consists of 17 tenured and tenure-track faculty, 7 teaching faculty, and about 80 graduate students, organized around traditional and cross-cutting research areas. Further information be found at the Department website: <https://chemistry.wvu.edu/>
