**Required:**

- PhD in chemistry or a chemistry-related discipline. ABD candidates may be considered if the degree will be completed by May 2022.
- Demonstrated commitment to undergraduate education

**Preferred Qualifications:**

- Experience teaching Chemistry

Qualified applicants must submit a cover letter, CV, transcripts, a teaching philosophy, a statement of research, and a statement describing your experiences with diverse student populations and how you intend, through your teaching, research, or service, to contribute to diversity and inclusion in our department and the broader Widener University community.
